Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (4652-77 12" Blocks – Navy):

- Fussy cut (6) 10 ½" squares each centered on a block.

Fabric B (4661-11 Pinwheels – Light Blue), cut:

- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 59 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 47 ½" strips.

Fabric C (4657-88 Bandana – Red), cut:

- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (6) 1" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1" x 14 ½" strips.
- (4) 1" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1" x 13 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric D (4660-11 Stars – Light Blue), cut:

- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 13 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 11 ½" strips.

Fabric E (4655-66 Landscape – Green), cut:

- (2) 7 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 7 ½" squares.

Fabric F (4660-88 Stars – Red), cut:

- (3) 1" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1" x 8 ½" strips.
- (3) 1" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric G (4658-01W Foulard – Pigment White), cut:

- (2) 3 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 3 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (96) triangles.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 56 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 45 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric H (4657-77 Bandana – Navy), cut:

- (4) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 61 ½" strips.
- (3) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 57 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ⅞" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2 ⅞" squares. Cut the squares across one diagonal to make (96) triangles.

Fabric I (4658-71 Foulard – Royal), cut:

- (2) 3 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 3 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (96) triangles.

Fabric J (4659-78 Tossed Flags – Patriotic), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.

Backing (4654-78 Patchwork – Patriotic), cut:

- (2) 79" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 65" x 79" to make the back.

Sewing

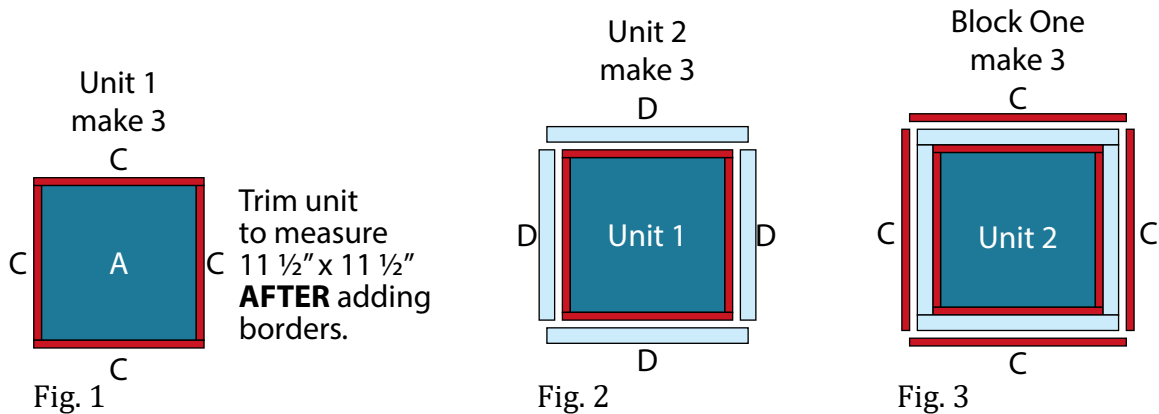
Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of (1) $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square (Cow Medallion). Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square. Trim the block to measure $11\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (3) Unit 1 squares total.

2. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $11\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $13\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (3) Unit 2 squares total.

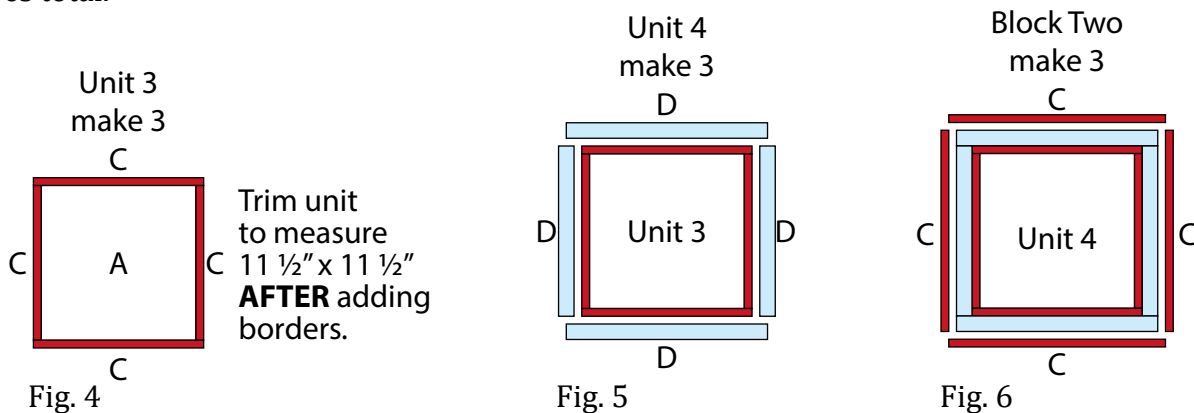
3. Sew (1) 1 " x $13\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square. Sew (1) 1 " x $14\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (3) Block One squares total.



4. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of (1) $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square (Cow Portrait). Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square. Trim the block to measure $11\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (3) Unit 3 squares total.

5. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $11\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of (1) Unit 3 square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $13\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 3 square to make (1) Unit 4 square (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (3) Unit 4 squares total.

6. Sew (1) 1 " x $13\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 4 square. Sew (1) 1 " x $14\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 4 square to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (3) Block Two squares total.



7. Sew (1) 1" x 7 1/2" Fabric F strip to each side of (1) 7 1/2" Fabric E square. Sew (1) 1" x 8 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric E square to make (1) Unit 5 square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (6) Unit 5 squares total.

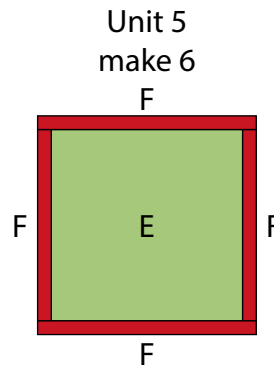

8. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 8 1/2" Fabric G strip to each side of (1) Unit 5 square. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 10 1/2" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 5 square to make (1) Unit 6 square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (6) Unit 6 squares total.

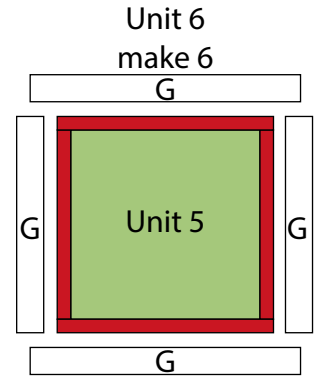

9. Sew (1) Fabric I triangle and (1) Fabric G triangle together as shown in Figure 9 to make (1) IG triangle. Sew (1) Fabric H triangle to the long side of the IG triangle to make (1) Unit 7 square. Trim unit to measure 2 1/2" square. Repeat to make (48) Unit 7 squares total.

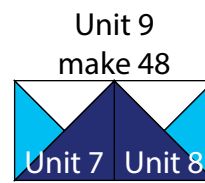

12. Paying attention to the orientation of the strips, sew (1) Unit 9 strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 2 1/2" Fabric J square to make (1) Side Border. Repeat to make a second Side Border. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of (1) Unit 6 square (Fig. 12).

13. Paying attention to the orientation of the strips, sew (3) 2 1/2" Fabric J squares and (2) Unit 9 strips together end to end and alternating them to make the Top Border. Repeat to make the Bottom Border. Sew the borders to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 6 square from Step 12 to make (1) Block Three square (Fig. 12).

14. Repeat Steps 12-13 to make (6) Block Three squares total.

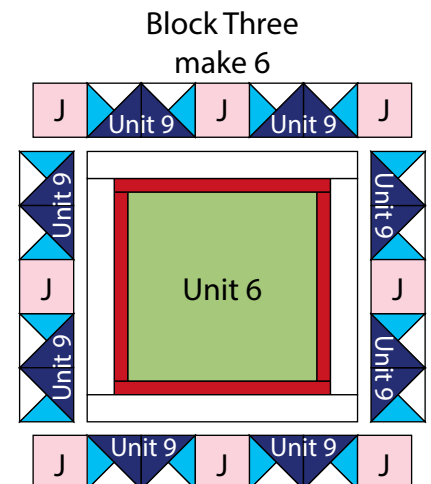

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

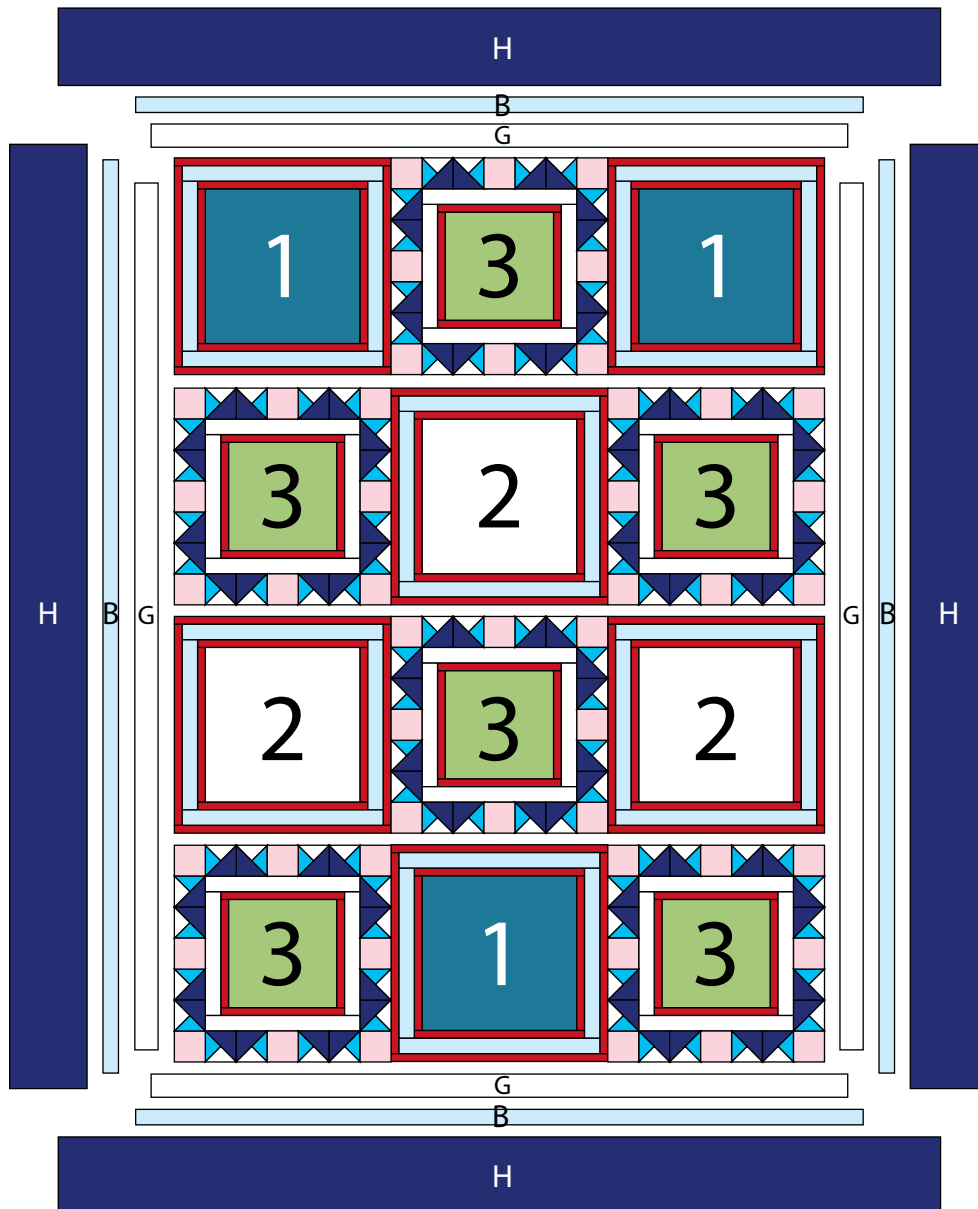
15. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Three square to make Row One.
16. Sew (1) Block Three square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row Two.
17. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block Three square to make Row Three.
18. Sew (1) Block Three square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Four.
19. Sew the (4) Rows together, in numerical order, to make the Center Block.
20. Sew (1) 2" x 56 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 45 ½" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
21. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 59 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 47 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
22. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 61 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 57 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

23. Press the quilt top and 65" x 79" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

24. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric C binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
25. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
