## Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted. WOF = Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

## Pillow \#1

Fabric A (5767G-98 Border Stripe - Multi), cut:

- (1) $2411 / 2 " \times 91 / 2 "$ WOF strip.

Fabric B (5765-88 Tone-on-Tone Bugs - Red), cut: - (2) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 241 / 2 "$ WOF strips.

Fabric C (5759G-99 Bugs in Jars - Black), cut: -(2) $241 / 2 "$ x 3 " WOF strips.

Backing (5759G-99 Bugs in Jars - Black), cut:

- (1) $241 / 2$ " x $16 \frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strip for the back.


## Pillow \#2

Fabric A (5762-88 Tossed Beetles - Red), cut:

- (1) $141 / 2$ " x $201 / 2$ " rectangle.

Fabric B (5766-14 Multi-Colored Cheetah Skin Aqua), cut:

- See instructions to cut (2) Small Circles (C-3).

Fabric C (5759G-99 Bugs in Jars - Black), cut:

- See instructions to cut (2) Large Circles (C-1).

Fabric D (5763-1 Tossed Ladybugs - White), cut: - See instructions to cut (2) Small Circles (C-3).

Fabric E (5761G-99 Tossed Bugs on Skin - Black), cut:

- See instructions to cut (2) Medium Circles (C-2).

Fabric F (5762-99 Tossed Beetles - Black), cut:

- See instructions to cut (1) Medium Circle (C-2).

Fabric G (5764-90 Zebra Skin - Black/White), cut:

- See instructions to cut (1) Small Circle (C-3).

Backing (5762-88 Tossed Beetles - Red), cut:

- (1) $14 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ " $201 / 2$ " WOF strip for the back.


## Pillow \#3

Fabric A (5759G-99 Bugs in Jars - Black), cut:

- (1) $4 ½ "$ square.

Fabric B (5765-88 Tone-on-Tone Bugs - Red), cut:

- (1) $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips and (2) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.

Fabric C (5762-99 Tossed Beetles - Black), cut: - (1) $21 / 2$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) $21 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2$ " strips and (2) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 101 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ strips.

Fabric D (5762-88 Tossed Beetles - Red), cut:

- (1) $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip, sub-cut (2) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 10 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $121 / 2$ " strips.

Fabric E (5761G-99 Tossed Bugs on Skin - Black), cut:

- (2) $31 / 2 "$ x WOF strips, sub-cut (4) $31 / 2$ " x $121 / 2$ " strips.

Fabric F (5760G-88 Big Dots - Red), cut:

- (1) $31 / 2$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) $31 / 2$ " squares.

Backing (5762-99 Tossed Beetles - Black), cut:

- (1) $131 / 2 "$ x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) $131 / 2$ " x $181 / 2$ " strips for the back.


## Sewing

Sew using a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

## Pillow \#1 Assembly

1. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 24 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip lengthwise to the top and to the bottom of (1) $91 / 2$ " x $241 / 2$ " Fabric A strip. Sew (1) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 241 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip lengthwise to the top and to the bottom of the newly sewn strip to make Pillow Top \#1 (Fig. 1).
2. Sew together the Pillow Top \#1 and (1) $16 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 24 \frac{1}{2}$ " Backing strip right sides together, leaving a space for turning the pillow right side out.
3. Turn the pillow right side out and fill with poly fil.

## Pillow \#2 Assembly

5. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about $1 / 8$ " outside the drawn lines.
6. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
7. Refer to Figure 2 to arrange and press the assorted circles onto the $14 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 201 / 2$ " Fabric A strip.
8. Finish the raw edges of each circle with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make the Pillow Top \#2.
9. Sew together the Pillow Top \#2 and (1) $14 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 201 / 2$ " Backing strip right sides together, leaving a space for turning the pillow right side out.
10. Turn the pillow right side out and fill with poly fil.
11. Sew the opening closed to complete Pillow \#2

## Pillow \#3 Assembly

12. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ Fabric A square. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ " x $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make the Unit 1 square (Fig. 3).
13. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 61 / 2$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the Unit 1 square. Sew (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make the Unit 2 square (Fig. 4).
14. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ " $\times 10 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of the Unit 2 square. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 square to make the Unit 3 square (Fig. 5).
15. Sew (1) $31 / 2^{\prime} \times 121 / 2 \prime 2$ Fabric E strip to each side of the Unit 3 square. Sew (1) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $F$ square to each end of (1)
$31 / 2 " \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric E strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 3 square to make the Pillow Top \#3 (Fig. 6).

16. Turn under the $181 / 2$ " edge of (1) Backing strip approximately $1 / 4$ ", press and repeat to make a finished edge on one edge of the $131 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 181 / 2$ " Backing pieces. Repeat with the second $131 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 181 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Backing piece.
17. Position and pin each Backing piece, right sides together with the Pillow Top \#3, overlapping the finished edges in the middle and aligning the raw edges with the pillow front (Fig. 7). Stitch around the pillow front and back to complete the pillow.
18. Turn the pillow right side out to complete Pillow \#3.
