(F) 5217-1 $\frac{1}{4}$ yard
(G) 1351-Pigment White** $\frac{1}{2}$ yard
(H) 5220-17 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ yards

(I) 5219-11 $\frac{1}{4}$ yard
Backing
5218-14 4 yards

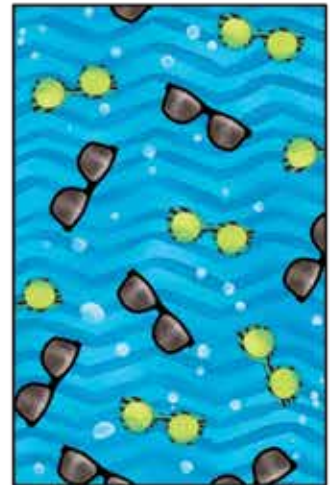

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5213-77 24" Block Repeat – Multi):

- Fussy cut (6) 11" squares, each centered on a block.

Fabric B (1351-Navy Just Color! – Navy), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 11" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 14" strips.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric C (5216-77 Seahorse Toss – Navy), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 36 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 1" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1" x 5 ½" strips.
- (2) 1" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1" x 6 ½" strips.

Fabric D (5215-44 Starfish and Sand Dollar Toss – Yellow), cut:

- (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 3 ½" squares.
- (1) 2" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 2" strips.

Fabric E (5214-11 Sunglass Toss – Blue), cut:

- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

Fabric F (5217-1 Tossed Dogs – White/Multi), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 5 ½" squares.

Fabric G (1351-Pigment White Just Color! – Pigment White), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2" squares.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

Fabric H (5220-17 Novelty Dog Stripe – Multi), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x 51 ½" LOF strips.
- (2) 6 ½" x 39 ½" LOF strips.

Fabric I (5219-11 Water – Blue), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 6 ½" squares.

Backing (5218-14 Stacked Dogs – Multi), cut:

- (2) 71" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 59" x 71" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 11" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 11" Fabric A block. Sew (1) 2" x 14" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A block. **Trim the block to measure 12 ½" square** to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

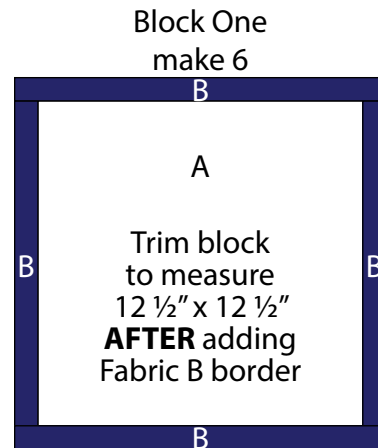

2. Sew (1) 1" x 5 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of (1) 5 ½" Fabric B square. Sew (1) 1" x 6 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric B square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.

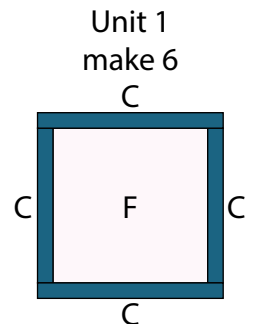

3. Place (1) 2" Fabric G square on the bottom left corner of (1) 3 ½" Fabric D square, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 4). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam.

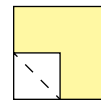

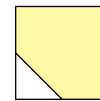

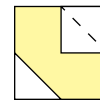

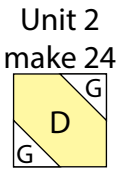

4. Follow Figure 5 for the seam direction to add a 2" Fabric G square to the upper right corner of the 3 ½" Fabric D square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 6).

5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (24) Unit 2 squares total.

6. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric E strip to the top of (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric G strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (24) Unit 3 strips total.

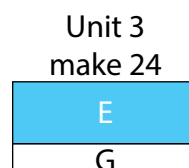

7. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of (1) Unit 3 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.

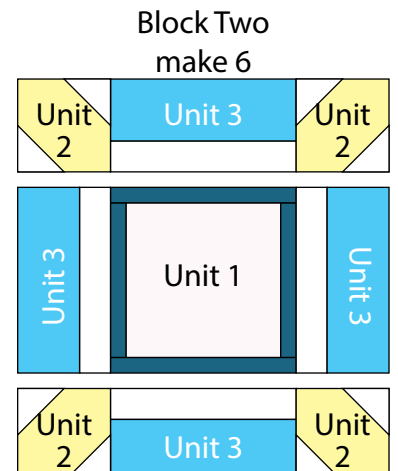

8. Sew (1) 2" Fabric D square to each end of (1) 2" x 36 ½" Fabric C strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 9). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

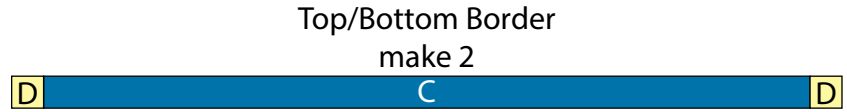

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

9. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.

10. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.

11. Sew the (4) Rows together, in numerical order, to make the Center Block.

12. Sew (1) 2" x 48 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block.

13. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

14. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 51 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 6 ½" Fabric I square to each end of (1) 6 ½" x 39 ½" Fabric H strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

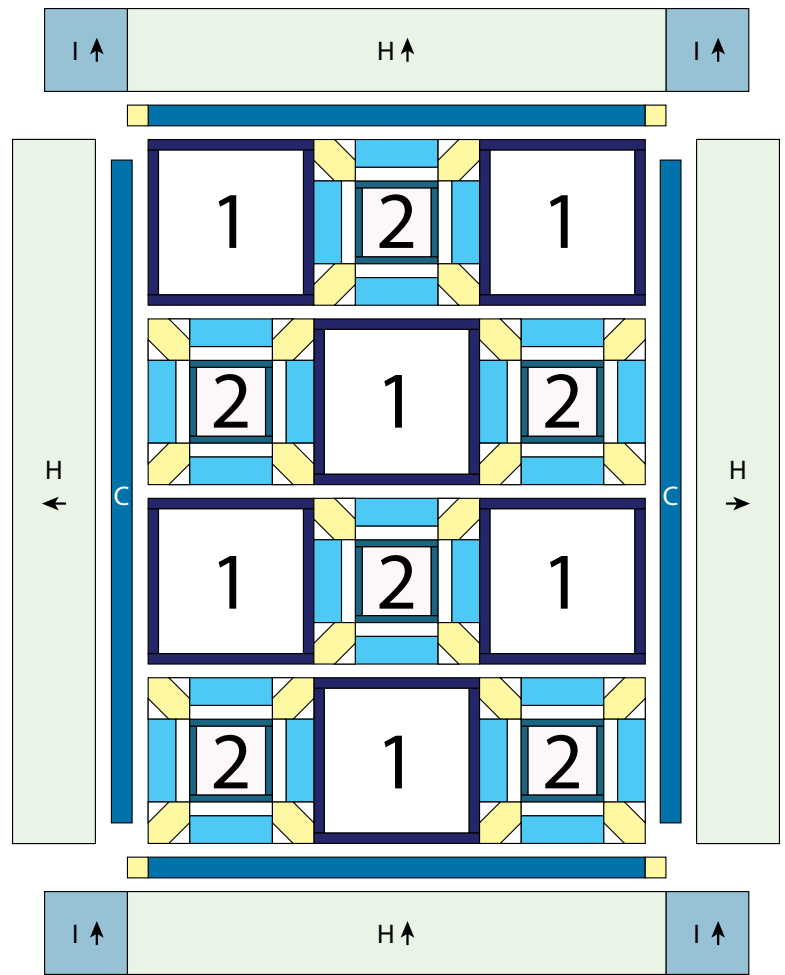
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

15. Press the quilt top and 59" x 71" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

16. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

17. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
