

#### **Additional Supplies Needed**


Batting 53" x 63" (Recommended: Air Lite® Colour Me 100% Cotton) Piecing and sewing thread Quilting and sewing supplies Quilt designed by Heidi Pridemore

### **Cutting**

#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### Fabric A (6326P-49 36 Inch Sheep Panel - Gray):

• Fussy cut (1) 27 ½" x 37 ¾" rectangle, centered on the panel.

#### Fabric B (6321-44 Tossed Numbers - Yellow), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x 37 ¾" WOF strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x 31 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 47 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 40 ½" WOF strips.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### Fabric C (6324-49 Counting Sheep Stripe - Multi), fussy cut:

- (2) 4" x 51" LOF strips, each centered on a row of sheep.
- (2) 4" x 41" LOF strips, each centered on a row of sheep.

#### Fabric D (6320-44 Tossed Sheep - Yellow), cut:

• (1) 3" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 3" squares.

#### Fabric E (6322-49 Sheep in Big Dots - Multi), cut:

• (2) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (9) 3" x 5 ½" strips.

#### Fabric F (6320-90 Tossed Sheep - Gray), cut:

• (2) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (9) 3" x 5 ½" strips.

#### Fabric G (6323-49 Stars - White/Gray), cut:

• (2) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (9) 3" x 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

#### Fabric H (6321-90 Tossed Numbers - Gray), cut:

• (2) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (9) 3" x 5 ½" strips.

#### Backing (6325-49 Small Squares - Multi), cut:

• (2) 53" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 53" x 63" to make the back.




Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.


#### **Block Assembly**


Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $37\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the  $27\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $37\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $31\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 30** ½" x 40 ½".



- 2. Follow Figure 2 and sew together (10) assorted  $3" \times 5 \frac{1}{2}"$  strips end to end to make the Left Side Border. Repeat to make the Right Side Border (Fig. 3).
- 3. Follow Figure 4 and sew together (8) assorted 3"  $\times$  5 ½" strips end to end. Sew (1) 3" Fabric D square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border. Repeat to make the Bottom Border (Fig. 5).






#### **Quilt Top Assembly**

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

4. Center (1) 4" x 51" Fabric C strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

- 5. Repeat Step 4 to sew (1)  $4" \times 41"$  Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start  $\frac{1}{4}"$  away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 6).
- 6. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 6), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.




- 7. Sew (1) 2" x 47  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 40  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 8. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and right sides of the Center Block.
- 9. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

#### Layering, Quilting and Finishing

10. Press the quilt top and 53" x 63" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

#### **Binding**

- 11. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 12. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
