## Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted. WOF $=$ Width of Fabric $\bullet$ LOF $=$ Length of Fabric

Fabric A (4833P-22 Bunny in Teacup Panel - Pink):

- Fussy cut (1) $26 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $401 / 2 "$ panel.

Fabric B (1351-Pigment White Just Color! - Pigment White), cut:

- (1) $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip, sub-cut (28) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (2) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 40 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ " WOF strips.
- (2) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 321 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ WOF strips.
- (3) $17 / 8$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) $17 / 8$ " squares.
- (3) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 51 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (2) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 41 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ WOF strips.
- (1) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ x WOF strip, sub-cut (24) $1 \frac{1}{4}$ " x $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ strips.
- (6) $1 \frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (192) $1 \frac{1}{4}$ " squares.

Fabric C (4829-12 Tossed Teacups - White), cut:

- (1) $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip, sub-cut (4) $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ " squares.

Fabric D (4830-11 Tossed Cupcakes - Aqua), cut:

- (2) $21 / 2 "$ x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 23 / 4 "$ strips.
- (2) $21 / 4 "$ x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) $21 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ x 3 " strips.
- (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2$ " strips.

Fabric E (1351-Light Teal Just Color! - Light Teal), cut:

- (6) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips for the binding.
- See instructions to cut (12) Bow Centers.

Fabric F (4831-22 Floral with Butterflies - Pink), cut:

- (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 23 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ strips.
- (1) $21 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) $21 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 3$ " strips.
- (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ x 2" strips.
- See instructions to cut (6) Bow Centers.

Fabric G (4832-22 Dot - Pink), cut:

- (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip, sub-cut (12) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 23 / 4 "$ strips.
- (1) $21 / 1^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) $21 \frac{1}{4} " \times 3$ " strips.
- (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ x 2 " strips.
- See instructions to cut (6) Bow Centers.

Fabric H (4835-12 Novelty Stripe - Aqua/Pink), fussy cut:

- (2) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 531 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ LOF strips, each centered on a blue strip.
- (2) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ LOF strips, each centered on a pink strip.

Fabric I (4832-12 Dot - White), cut:

- (1) $31 / 2 \prime$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) $31 / 2$ " squares.

Backing (4828-12 Patchwork Critters - Aqua/Pink), cut:

- (2) 67 " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 55 " x 67 " to make the back.

Sew using a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

## Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) $31 / 2$ " $\times 401 / 2$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the $261 / 2 " \times 401 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A panel. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 321 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure $31 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 431 / 2 "$ to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).
2. Place (1) $1 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) $2 \frac{1}{2} /{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 23 / 4 "$ Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam. Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 3).
3. Follow Figure 4 for the seam direction to add a $11 / 4$ " Fabric B square to the upper right and lower left corners of the $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 23 / 4 "$ Fabric D strip to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 5).
4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (12) Unit 1 rectangles total.

5. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to Figure 6 for the fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (12) Unit 2 rectangles.
6. Repeat Steps 2-3, refer to Figure 7 and sew (1) $1 / 1 / 4$ " Fabric B square to the upper left corner and (1) $17 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B square to the lower right corner of (1) $21 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 3$ " Fabric D strip to make (1) Unit 3 rectangle. Repeat to make (12) Unit 3 rectangles total.
7. Repeat Steps $2-3$, refer to Figure 8 and sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B square to the upper right corner and (1) $17 / 8$ " Fabric B square to the lower left corner of (1) $21 / 4 \prime$ x 3 " Fabric D strip to make (1) Unit 4 rectangle. Repeat to make (12) Unit 4 rectangles total.
8. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{4}$ " x $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to the top of (1) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 2$ " Fabric D strip to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (12) Unit 5 strips total.

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations while assembling.
9. Sew (1) Unit 1 rectangle to the left side of (1) Unit 5 strip. Sew (1) Unit 2 rectangle to the right side of the Unit 5 strip to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 3 rectangle to the left side of (1) Unit 4 rectangle to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) rows together to make (1) Unit 6 rectangle (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (12) Unit 6 rectangles total.
10. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about $1 / 8$ " outside the drawn lines.

11. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
12. Refer to Figure 11 to arrange and press (1) Fabric E bow center onto (1) Unit 6 rectangle.
13. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make
(1) Unit 7 rectangle.
14. Repeat Steps 12-13 to make (12) Unit 7 rectangles total.
15. Repeat Steps 2-13 and refer to Figures 12-13 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (6) Unit 8 rectangles and (6) Unit 9 rectangles.

16. Sew (8) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strips and (7) assorted units together, alternating them, to make (1) Side Border (Fig. 14). Repeat to make a second Side Border.

17. Sew (6) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strips and (5) assorted units together, alternating them. Sew (1) $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ Fabric C square to each end of the sewn strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 15). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
18. Sew the Side, Top and Bottom Borders to the Center Block.
19. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 51 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 41 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
20. Sew (1) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 531 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric I square to each end of (1) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

## Layering, Quilting and Finishing

21. Press the quilt top and $55^{\prime \prime} \times 67$ " backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

## Binding

22. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric E binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
23. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
