## Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.
WOF = Width of Fabric $\bullet$ LOF $=$ Length of Fabric
Fabric A (4478P-62 30" Block Panel - Multi):

- Fussy cut (1) $28 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 \frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric B (4480-22 Hearts Allover - Pink), cut:

- (2) 3 " x 41 1/2" strips
- (2) $211 / 2$ " $\times 331 / 2$ " strips

Fabric C (4473-66 Lemons - Green/Yellow), cut:

- (1) $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ width of fabric (WOF) strip. Sub-cut (4) $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ squares

Fabric D (4475-22 Pineapples - Pink), cut:

- (1) $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) $41 / 2 "$ squares

Fabric E (4476-44 Flip Flops - Yellow), cut:

- (1) $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strip. Sub-cut (5) $41 / 2 "$ squares

Fabric F (4481-66 Ice Cream - Green), cut:

- (2) $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 8 \frac{1}{2 \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips

Fabric G (4471-44 Cherries - Yellow), cut:

- (1) $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strip. Sub-cut (5) $41 / 2 "$ squares

Fabric H (4470-22 Strawberries - Pink), cut:

- (1) $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) $41 / 2$ " squares

Fabric I (4477-66 Watermelon - Green/Red), cut:

- (1) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) $41 / 2 "$ squares

Fabric J (1351-Pigment White Just Color!-Pigment White), cut:

- (4) $21 / 21$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2 "$ strips.
- (1) $21 / 2 "$ x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) $21 / 2 "$ x $61 / 2 "$ strips.
- (2) $21 / 2 "$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) $21 / 2 "$ x $8 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ strips.

Fabric K (1351-Sunshine Just Color!-Sunshine), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x $56 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ strips.
- (3) 2 " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 " x $471 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.

Fabric L (4482-66 Summer Motif Tossed - Green), cut:

- (3) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $41 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 591 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.
- (3) $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 471 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.

Fabric M (4472-62 Sunglasses-White/Multi), cut:

- (1) $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) $4 \frac{1}{2} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares.

Fabric N (1351-Carnation Just Color! - Carnation), cut:

- (7) $211 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips for the binding.

Backing (4479-2 Flamingos - White/Pink), cut:

- (2) 75 " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 63 " x 75 " to make the back.

Sew using a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

## Block Assembly

Note: Arrows in figures represent the fabric direction.

1. Sew (1) 3" $\times 41 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $28 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 41 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ Fabric A panel. Sew (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 331 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim to measure $321 / 2 " \times 441 / 2 "$ to make the center block (Fig. 1).
2. Sew (1) $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the right side of (1) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square. Sew (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2 "$ Fabric J strip to the bottom of the sewn unit to make (1) Unit 1 block (Fig. 2). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 block.
3. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric J strip to the bottom of (1) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square. Sew (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the left side of the sewn unit to make (1) Unit 2 block (Fig. 3).
4. Sew (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the top of (1) $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric D square. Sew (1) $21 / 2$ " $\times 6 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the right side of the sewn unit to make (1) Unit 3 block (Fig. 4).

5. Sew (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric J strip to the top of (1) $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ " Fabric C square to make (1) Unit 4 block (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (4) Unit 4 blocks total.
6. Sew (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the bottom of (1) $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ Fabric D square to make (1) Unit 5 block (Fig. 6).
7. Sew (1) $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the left side of (1) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to make (1) Unit 6 block (Fig. 7).
8. Sew (1) $2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 4 \underline{1} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric J strip to the top of (1) $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ " Fabric D square to make (1) Unit 7 block (Fig. 8).

9. Sew (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the right side of (1) $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ " Fabric D square to make (1) Unit 8 block (Fig. 9).
10. Sew (1) $21 / 2$ " $\times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the top of (1) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to make (1) Unit 9 block (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (5) Unit 9 blocks total.
11. Sew (1) $2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 8 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the bottom of (1) $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 8 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to make (1) Unit 10 block (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (6) Unit 10 blocks total.
12. Sew (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the top of (1) $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 11 block (Fig. 12).
13. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the right side of (1) $41 / 2 "$ Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 12 block (Fig. 13).

14. Sew (1) $21 / 2$ " $\times 41 / 2$ " Fabric J strip to the bottom of (1) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 13 block (Fig. 14).
15. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ Fabric J strip to the left side of (1) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 14 block (Fig. 15).
16. Sew (1) $2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the bottom of (1) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square to make (1) Unit 15 block (Fig. 16). Repeat to make (4) Unit 15 blocks total.
17. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ Fabric J strip to the top of (1) $41 / 2 "$ Fabric I square to make (1) Unit 16 block (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (4) Unit 16 blocks total.

18. Sew together (1) Unit 16 block, (1) Unit 8 block, (1) Unit 14 block, (1) Unit 10 block, (1) Unit 9 block, (1) Unit 10 block, (1) Unit 14 block, (1) Unit 15 block and (1) Unit 4 block, in that order, to make the Left Border strip (Fig. 18). Sew the border to the left side of the center block.
19. Sew together (1) Unit 4 block, (1) Unit 15 block, (1) Unit 9 block, (1) Unit 10 block, (1) Unit 12 block, (1) Unit 10 block, (1) Unit 9 block, (1) Unit 6 block and (1) Unit 16 block, in that order, to make the Right Border strip (Fig. 19). Sew the border to the right side of the center block.
20. Sew together (1) Unit 1 block, (1) Unit 4 block, (1) Unit 5 block, (1) Unit 9 block, (1) Unit 10 block, (1) Unit 11 block, (1) Unit 15 block, (1) Unit 16 block and (1) Unit 2 block, in that order, to make the Top Border strip (Fig. 20). Sew the border to the top of the center block.
21. Sew together (1) Unit 3 block, (1) Unit 16 block, (1) Unit 15 block, (1) Unit 9 block, (1) Unit 10 block, (1) Unit 13 block, (1) Unit 7 block, (1) Unit 4 block and (1) Unit 1 block, in that order, to make the Bottom Border strip (Fig. 21). Sew the border to the bottom of the center block to make the quilt top.

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
22. Sew (1) 2" x $56 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 2" x $471 / 2$ " Fabric K strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
23. Sew (1) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 591 / 2 "$ Fabric L strip to each side of the quilt top.
24. Sew (1) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric M square to each end of (1) $41 / 2 " \times 47 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric L strip to make the top border. Repeat to make the bottom border. Sew the borders to the quilt top.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing
25. Press the quilt top and $63^{\prime \prime} \times 75^{\prime \prime}$ backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding
26. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric $N$ binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
27. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
