(G) 3612-22 .....	½ yard	**Peppered Cottons Collection

## Cutting

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### **Fabric A (3613-04 Small Bird Toss – Cream), cut:**

- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (14) 6 ½" squares.

#### **Fabric B (3611-22 Quadrafoil – Pink), cut:**

- (4) 4 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (33) 4 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (132) triangles.

#### **Fabric C (3612-44 Floral Medallions – Yellow), cut:**

- (7) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips, sub-cut (66) 3 ⅞" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (132) triangles.

#### **Fabric D (3611-04 Quadrafoil –**

- (4) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (40) 3 ½" squares.

#### **Cream), cut:**

- (6) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (164) 2" squares.

#### **Fabric E (3611-66 Quadrafoil – Green), cut:**

- (5) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 87 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 30 ½" WOF strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### **Fabric F (3607-22 Bird Patchwork – Light Pink), cut:**

- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (13) 6 ½" squares.

#### **Fabric G (3612-22 Floral Medallions – Pink), cut:**

- (4) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (42) 3 ½" squares.

#### **Fabric H (3610-44 Jacobean Vine – Yellow), cut:**

- (4) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (42) 3 ½" squares.

#### **Fabric I (09-White Sugar Peppered Cottons – White Sugar), cut:**

- (4) 4 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (33) 4 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (132) triangles.

#### **Backing (3609-22 Brushed Ombre – Light Pink), cut:**

- (2) 101" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 47" x 101" for the back.

## Sewing

Sew using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

### Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) Fabric I triangle, (1) Fabric B triangle and (1) Fabric C triangle together to make (1) Unit 1 (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (66) Unit 1's total.
2. Sew (1) Fabric C triangle, (1) Fabric B triangle and (1) Fabric I triangle together to make (1) Unit 2 (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (66) Unit 2's total.
3. Sew (1) Unit 1 and (1) Unit 2 together to make (1) Unit 3 (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (66) Unit 3's total.







4. Sew (1) Unit 3 to each side of (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square. Sew (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to each end of (1) Unit 3. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (10) Block Ones total.






6. Place (1) 2" Fabric D square on the bottom left corner of (1) 3 ½" Fabric G square, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 7). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam.


7. Follow Figure 8 for the seam direction to add a 2" Fabric D square to the lower right corner of the 3 ½" Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 4 (Fig. 9).

8. Repeat Steps 6-7 to make (42) Unit 4's total.



9. Repeat Steps 6-7 using (38) 3 ½" Fabric H squares and (76) 2" Fabric D squares to make (38) Unit 5's (Fig. 10).

10. Place (1) 2" Fabric D square on the bottom right corner of (1) 3 ½" Fabric G square, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 6 (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (4) Unit 6's total.



## Runner Top Assembly

*(Follow the Runner Layout while assembling the top.)*

11. Sew (1) Block One to each side of (1) Block Two to make Row One. Repeat to make Rows Three, Five, Seven and Nine.

12. Sew (1) Block 2 to each side of (1) 6 ½" Fabric A square to make Row Two. Repeat to make Rows Four, Six and Eight.

13. Sew the (9) rows together, in numerical order, to make the runner top.

14. Sew (1) 2" x 87 ½" Fabric E strip to each long side of the runner top. Sew (1) 2" x 30 ½" Fabric E strip to each short side of the runner top.

15. Sew (15) Unit 4's and (14) Unit 5's together, alternating them, to make (1) strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each long side of the runner top.

16. Sew (6) Unit 4's and (5) Unit 5's together, alternating them. Sew (1) Unit 6 to each end of the resulting strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to each short side of the runner top.


### Layering, Quilting and Finishing

17. Press the runner top and 47" x 101" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed runner top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

### Binding

18. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric E binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

19. Sew the binding to the front of the runner, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
