- (B) 3314-90 ⅓ yard
- (C) 3316-11 ⅓ yard
- (D) 3314-11 ⅓ yard
- (E) 3312-88 1 yard
- (F) 3312-11 1 ½ yards*
- (G) 3310-09 1 ½ yards
- (H) 3311-09 1 ¾ yards

- (I) 3315-11 2 ½ yards
- Backing
- 3311-11 5 yards

*Includes binding

Additional Supplies Needed

- Batting 74" x 88"
- Piecing and sewing thread
- Quilting and sewing supplies

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (3309-18 Block Word Print – Multi):

- Fussy cut (4) 8 ½" squares.

Fabric B (3314-90 Bunnies – Gray), cut:

- (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 8 ½" squares.

Fabric C (3316-11 Ornaments – Blue), cut:

- (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 8 ½" squares.

Fabric D (3314-11 Bunnies – Blue), cut:

- (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (1) 8 ½" squares.

Fabric E (3312-88 Dot – Red), cut:

- (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (18) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (1) 10 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (18) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 60 ½" strips.
- (2) 3 ⅜" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 3 ⅜" squares.

Fabric F (3312-11 Dot – Blue), cut:

- (8) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 1 ½" x 60 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 48 ½" strips.
- (3) 3 ⅜" x WOF strips, sub-cut (30) 3 ⅜" squares.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric G (3310-09 Snowflake – White), cut:

- (4) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 62 ½" strips.
- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 54 ½" strips.
- (5) 3 ⅜" x WOF strips, sub-cut (54) 3 ⅜" squares.
- (3) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (36) 3" squares.

Fabric H (3311-09 Reindeer – White), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x 60 ½" LOF strips.

Fabric I (3315-11 Monotone Novelty Stripe – Blue), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x 84" LOF strips.
- (2) 6 ½" x 70" LOF strips.

Backing (3311-11 Reindeer – Blue), cut:

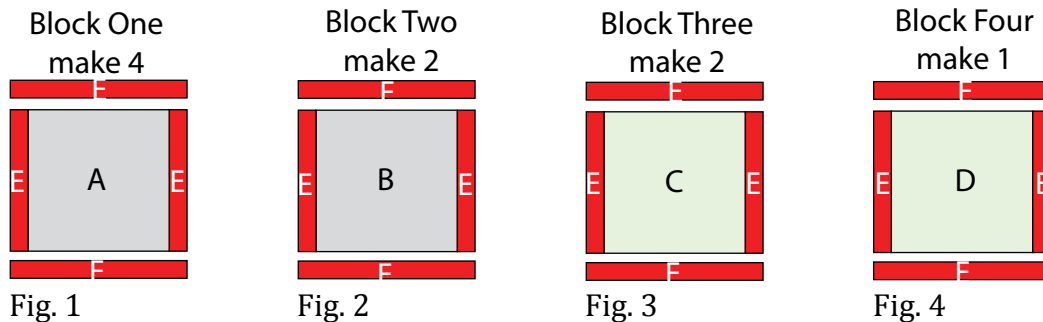
- (2) 88" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 74" x 88" for the back.

Sewing

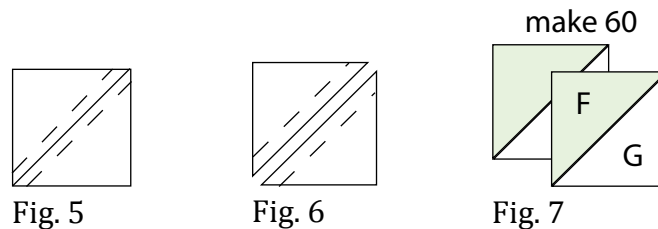
Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

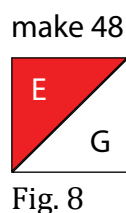
1. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (4) Block Ones total.
2. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric B square to make (1) Block Two (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (2) Block Twos total.
3. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric C square to make (1) Block Three (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (2) Block Threes total.
4. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric D square to make (1) Block Four (Fig. 4).



5. Place (1) $3\frac{3}{8}$ " Fabric G square on top of (1) $3\frac{3}{8}$ " Fabric F square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 5). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 6). Cut the two squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 6) to make (2) FG units (Fig. 7). Trim FG units to measure 3" square. Repeat to make (60) FG units total.



6. Repeat Step 5 using (24) $3\frac{3}{8}$ " Fabric E squares and (24) $3\frac{3}{8}$ " Fabric G squares to make (48) 3" EG units (Fig. 8).



7. Follow Figure 9 and sew (4) EG units, (8) FG units and (4) 3" Fabric G squares together to make (1) Block Five. Repeat to make (6) Block Fives total.

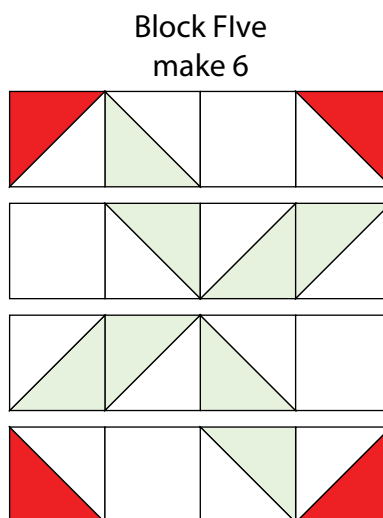

8. Follow Figure 10 and sew (4) FG units, (8) EG units and (4) 3" Fabric G squares together to make (1) Block Six. Repeat to make (3) Block Sixes total.

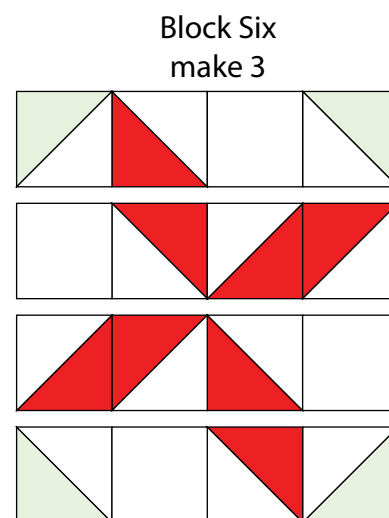

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

9. Sew (2) Block Ones, (3) Block Fives and (1) Block Two together to make (1) column. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the column to make Column One. Repeat to make Column Three.

10. Sew (3) Block Sixes, (2) Block Threes and (1) Block Four together to make (1) column. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of the column to make Column Two.

11. Sew the (3) columns, in numerical order, and (2) 6 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric H strips together, alternating them, to make the quilt top.

12. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 48 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top.

13. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 62 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 54 ½" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top.

14. Center (1) 6 ½" x 84" Fabric I strip on one side of the quilt top and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the quilt top and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

15. Repeat Step 14 to sew (1) 6 ½" x 70" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the quilt top. To miter each corner, fold the quilt top on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 11).

16. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 11), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

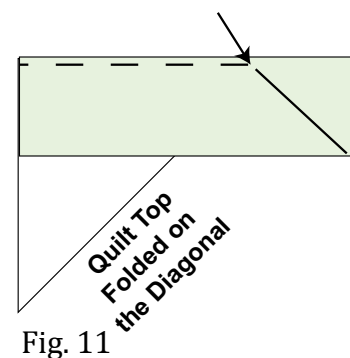

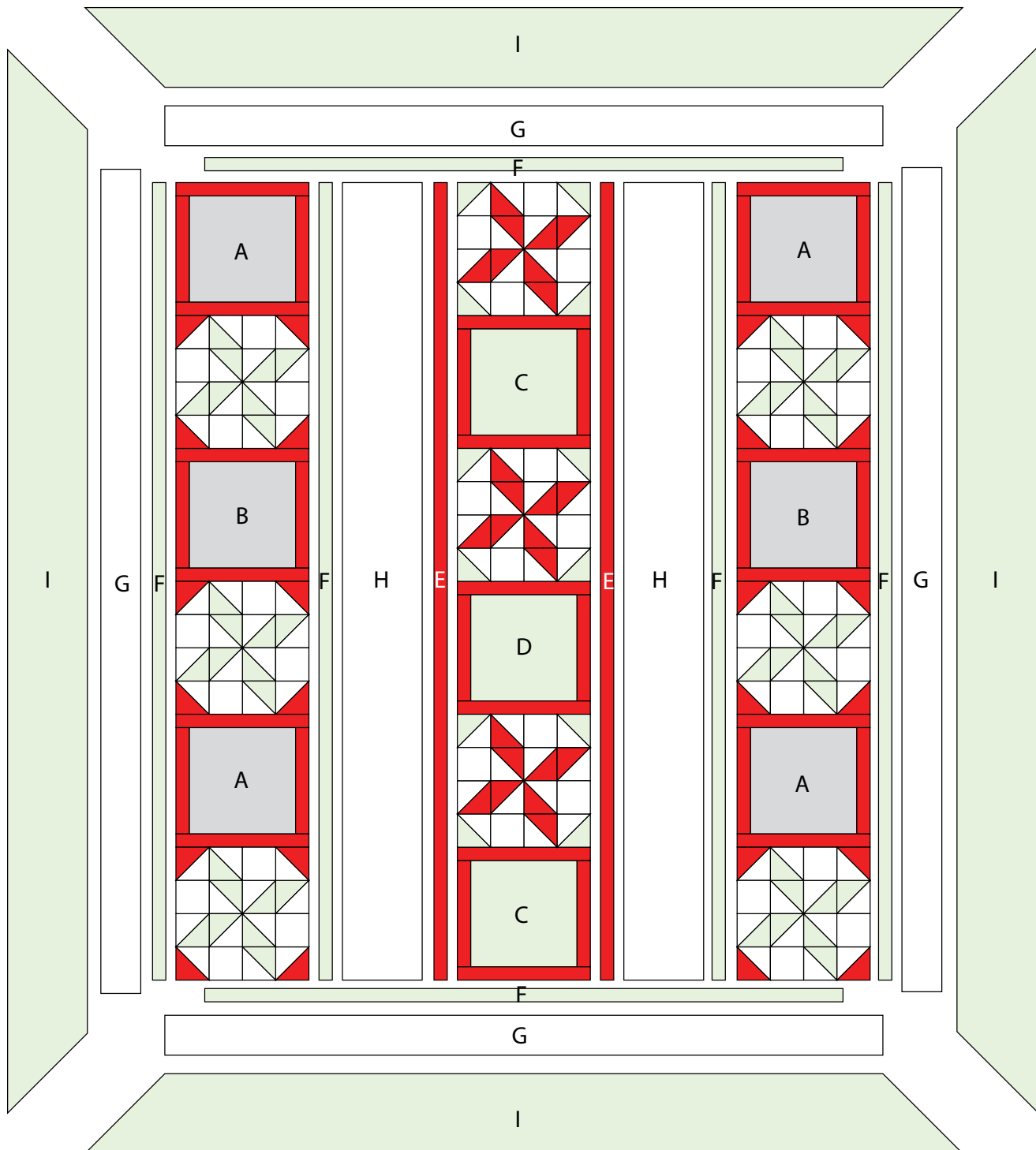
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

17. Press the quilt top and 74" x 88" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

18. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric F binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

19. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
