(A) 3860P-10	1 panel
(B) 1351-Pigment Wh	ite* ¾ yard
(C) 3862-17	1 ½ yards
(D) 3864-17	⅓ yard
(E) 3865-70	⅓ yard
(F) 3866-88	½ yard
(G) 1351-Aegean Blue	*¼ yard

(H) 1351-Sunshine* ¼ yard

(I) 1351-Grass*....... ¼ yard (J) 1351-Onyx**...... ½ yard Backing 3866-1 3 yards

Batting 52" x 68" (Recommended: Air Lite® Color Me 100% Cotton) Piecing and sewing thread Quilting and sewing supplies

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Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (3860P-10 24" Jungle Camp Panel-Multi):

• Fussy Cut (1) 21 ½" x 39"

Fabric B (1351-Pigment White Just Color!- Pigment White, cut:

- (2) 3" x 39" strips.
- (2) 3" x 26 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 36 ½" strips.
- (3) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Fabric C (3862-17 Animals in Vehicles-Light Blue), cut:

- (2) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 54" strips from the LOF
- (2) 4 ½" x 36" strips from the LOF

Fabric D (3864-17 Monkeys on Vines-Blue), cut:

• (2) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (12) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric E (3865-70 Jungle Animals and Words-Royal), cut:

• (2) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (12) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric F (3866-88 Textured Dots-Red), cut:

• (3) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (48) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Fabric G (1351-Aegean Blue Just Color!-Aegean Blue), cut:

• (2) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (24) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric H (1351-Sunshine Just Color!-Sunshine), cut:

• (3) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (48) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric I (1351-Grass Just Color!-Grass), cut:

• (2) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (24) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric J (1351-Onyx Just Color!-Onyx), cut:

• (6) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

Backing (3866-1 Textured Dots-White), cut:

• (2) 52" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 52" x 68" back.

Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Sewing Instructions

- 1. Sew (1) 3" x 39" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 21 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 39" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 3" x 26 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Center Block (Fig. 1).
- 2. Center (1) 4 ½" x 54" strip on one side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the quilt block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
- 3. Repeat Step 2 to sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36" strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each end of the quilt top. To miter each corner, fold the quilt block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 2).
- 4. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 2), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.
- 5. Place (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square on the left side of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " $x 4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 4). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.
- 6. Place (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square on the right side of the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 6). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle.





- 7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (24) Unit 1 rectangles.
- 8. Repeat Steps 5-6 using (24) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F rectangles, (24) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G squares and (24) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H squares to make (24) Unit 2 rectangles (Fig. 7).











9. Sew (1) Unit 1 rectangle to the top of (1) Unit 2 rectangle to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (24) Block One squares total.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the quilt Layout while assembling.)

- 10. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.


- 11. Sew (7) Block Ones, (3) 4 ½" Fabric D squares and (3) 4 ½" Fabric E squares to make the Left Side border. Repeat to make the right side border. Sew the borders to the quilt top.
- 12. Sew (5) Block One squares, (3) 4 ½" Fabric D squares and (3) 4 ½" Fabric E squares to make the top border. Repeat to make the bottom border. Sew the borders to the quilt top.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

13. Press the quilt top and 52" x 68" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

- 14. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric J binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 15. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
