- (B) 3866-1 3/4 yard
- (C) 3866-88* 7/8 yard
- (D) 1351-Aegean Blue** 1/3 yard
- (E) 1351-Sunshine** 1/3 yard
- (F) 3865-1 1/4 yard
- (G) 3864-1 1/4 yard
- (H) 3864-17 1/4 yard

- (I) 1351-Pigment White** 1/3 yard
- (J) 3863-70 1 1/3 yards
- Backing
- 3862-1 3 yards

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (3867P-40 Jungle Camp Boxes-Yellow/Multi):

- Fussy cut (15) 5 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles.

Fabric B (3866-1 Textured Dots-White), cut:

- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (30) 1 ½" x 5 ½" strips.
- (8) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (30) 2" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric C (3866-88 Textured Dots-Red), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (4) 4 ½" squares.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (60) 2 ½" squares.
- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric D (1351-Aegean Blue Just Color!-Aegean Blue), cut:

- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (60) 1 ½" x 3 ½" strips.

Fabric E (1351-Sunshine Just Color!-Sunshine), cut:

- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (60) 1 ½" x 3 ½" strips.

Fabric F (3865-1 Jungle Animals and Words-White), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (6) 3 ½" squares.

Fabric G (3864-1 Monkeys on Vines-White), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (5) 3 ½" squares.

Fabric H (3864-17 Monkeys on Vines-Blue), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (4) 3 ½" squares.

Fabric I (1351-Pigment White Just Color!-Pigment White), cut:

- (2) 2" x 42 ½" strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 2" x 38 ½" strips.

Fabric J (3863-70 Packed Jungle Animals-Royal), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x 45 ½" strips from the LOF.
- (2) 4 ½" x 38 ½" strips from the WOF, piece as needed.

Backing (3862-1 Animals in Vehicles-White), cut:

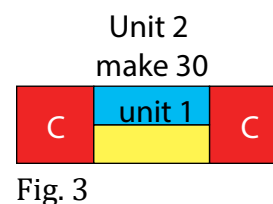
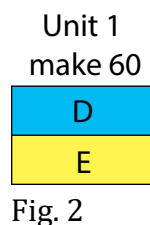
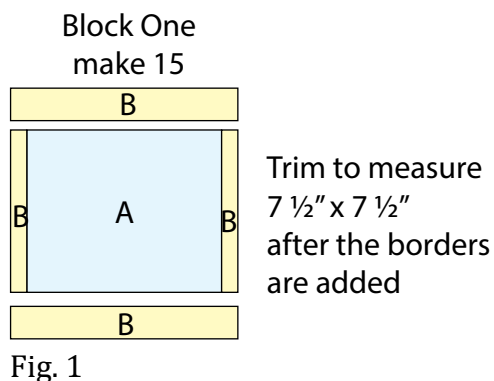
- (2) 54" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 54" x 61" back.

Sewing

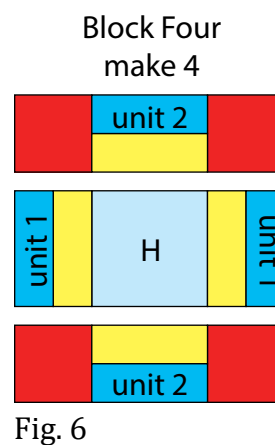
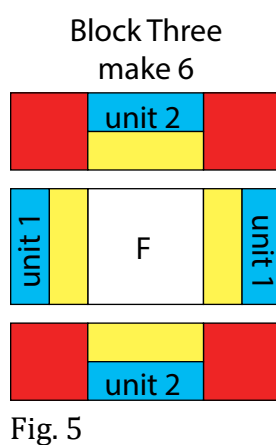
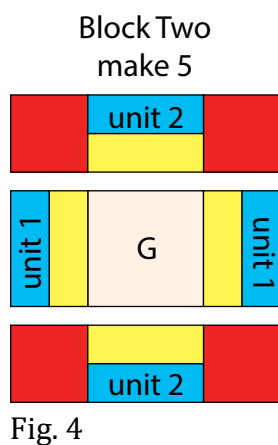
Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Sewing Instructions

1. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2 " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make (1) Block One square. Trim to measure $7\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (15) Block One squares.
2. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the top of (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to make one Unit 1 strip (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (60) Unit 1 strips.
3. Sew one $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square to each end of (1) Unit 1 rectangle to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (30) Unit 2 strips.



4. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square. Sew one Unit 2 strip to the top and bottom of the Fabric G square to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (5) Block Two squares.
5. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square. Sew one Unit 2 strip to the top and bottom of the Fabric F square to make (1) Block Three square (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (6) Block Three squares.
6. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square. Sew one Unit 2 strip to the top and bottom of the Fabric H square to make (1) Block Four square (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (4) Block Four squares.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling.)

7. Sew together (3) Block One squares, (1) Block Two square and (1) Block Three square to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three and Row Five.
8. Sew together (2) Block One squares, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Three square and (1) Block Four square to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Six.
9. Sew together (2) Block One squares, (1) Block Three square and (2) Block Four squares to make Row Four.
10. Sew the rows together in Numerical Order to make the quilt top.
11. Sew (1) 2" x 42 1/2" Fabric I strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) 2" x 38 1/2" Fabric I strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.

12. Sew (1) 4 1/2" x 45 1/2" Fabric J strip to each side of the quilt top.

13. Sew one 4 1/2" Fabric C square to each end of (1) 4 1/2" x 38 1/2" Fabric J to make the top border. Repeat to make the bottom border. Sew the borders to the quilt top.

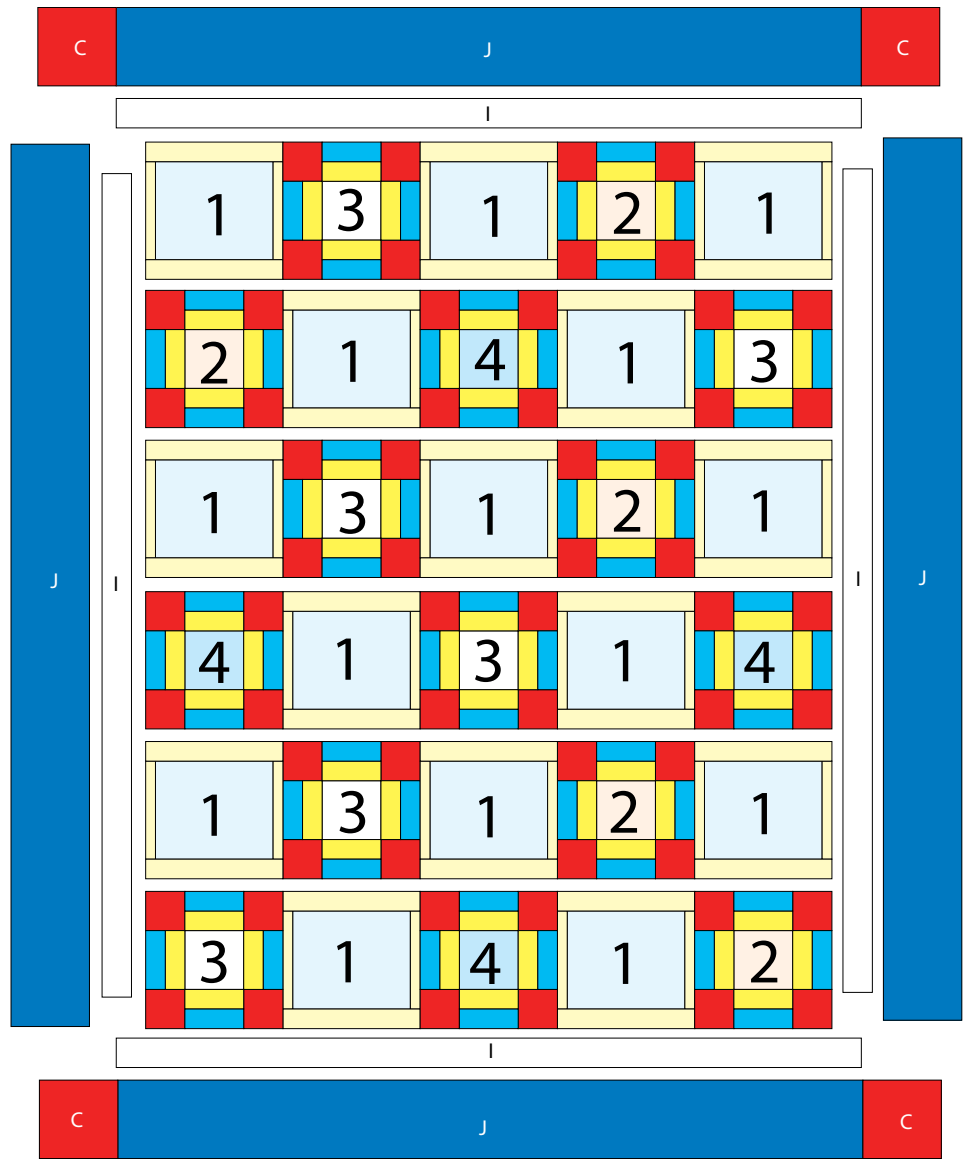
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

14. Press the quilt top and 54" x 61" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

15. Cut the ends of the (5) Fabric C binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

16. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
