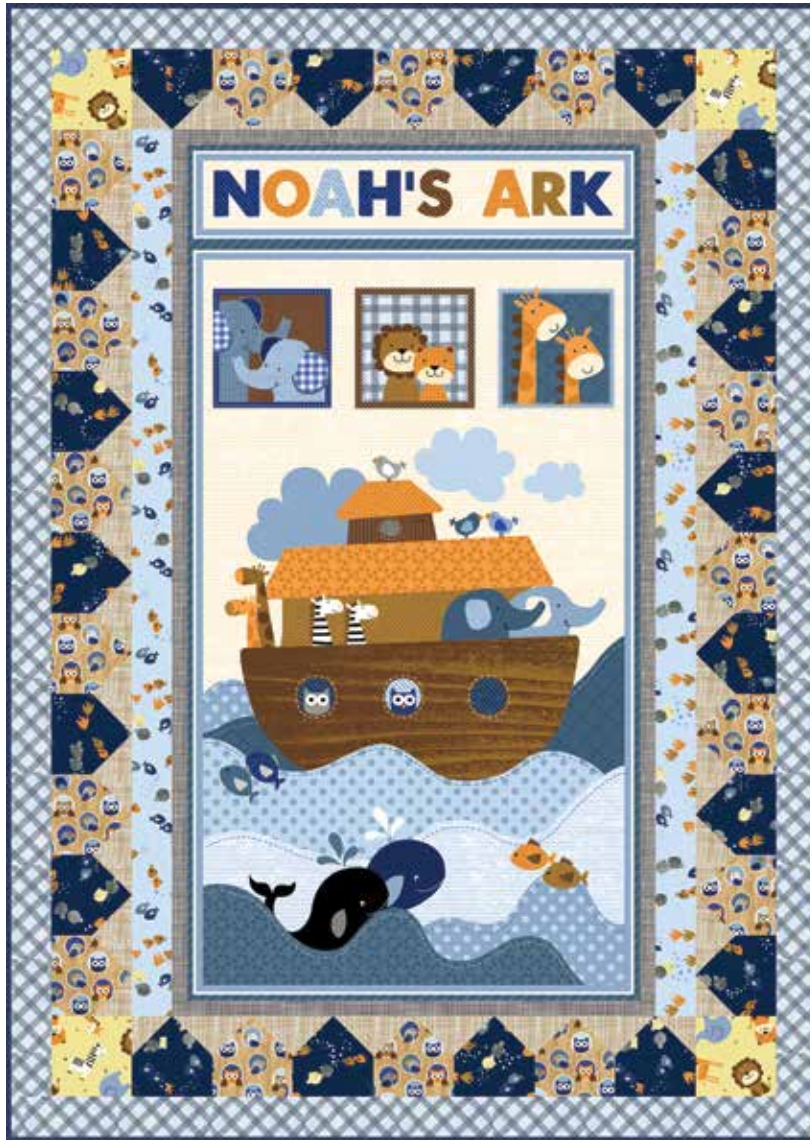

 (E) 3664-77 1/2 yard
 (F) 3665-43 3/8 yard
 (G) 3051-33 1/2 yard

(H) 3663-11 1/2 yard
 (I) 45-Ink** 1/2 yard*
 Backing
 3662-11 2 3/4 yards

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (3660P-41 24" Noah's Ark Panel – Cream/Blue):

- Fussy cut (1) 23" x 43" panel.

Fabric B (3051-09 Brushstrokes – Pewter), cut:

- (5) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 43" strips and (2) 2" x 26" strips.

Fabric C (3664-11 Fish – Light Blue), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 44 ½" strips.

Fabric D (3662-44 Tossed Animals – Medium Cream), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric E (3664-77 Fish – Navy), cut:

- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (19) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric F (3665-43 Birds – Tan/Brown), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (17) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric G (3051-33 Brushstrokes – Mushroom), cut:

- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (72) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric H (3663-11 Plaid – Blue), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 52 ½" strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x 40 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric I (45-Ink Peppered Cottons – Ink), cut:

- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Backing (3662-11 Tossed Animals – Light Blue), cut:

- (2) 48" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 48" x 64" for the back.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) 2" x 43" Fabric B strip to each side of the 23" x 43" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2" x 26" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure $24\frac{1}{2}$ " x $44\frac{1}{2}$ " to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).

2. Place (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square on the top left corner of (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 3). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam.

3. Follow Figure 4 for the seam direction to add a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square to the upper right corner of the $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to make (1) Unit 1 (Fig. 5).

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (19) Unit 1's total.

5. Repeat Steps 2-3 using (17) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F squares and (34) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G squares to make (17) Unit 2's (Fig. 6).

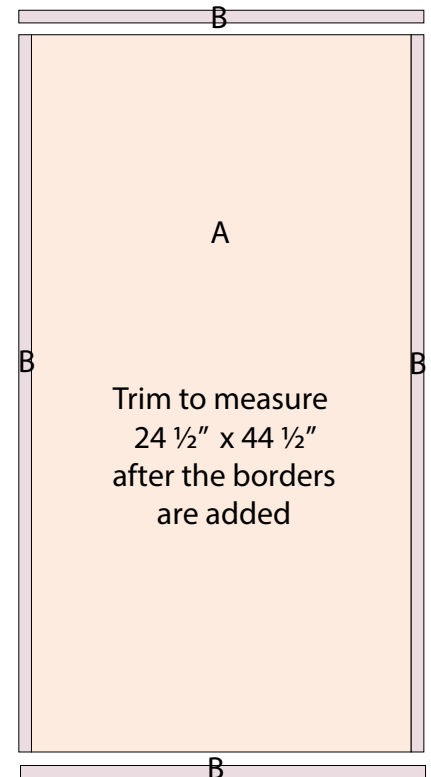

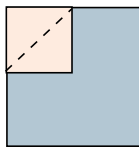

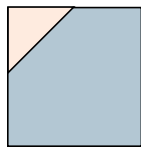

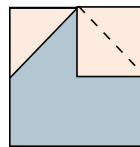

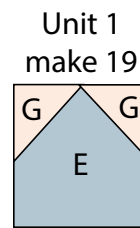

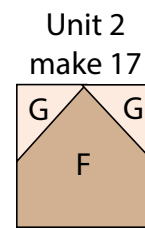

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

6. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $44\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block.

7. Sew (6) Unit 2's and (5) Unit 1's together, alternating them, to make the left side border. Sew the strip to the left side of the Center Block.

8. Sew (6) Unit 1's and (5) Unit 2's together, alternating them, to make the right side border. Sew the strip to the right side of the Center Block.

9. Sew (4) Unit 1's and (3) Unit 2's together. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to each end of both strips. Sew the resulting strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

10. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 52 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

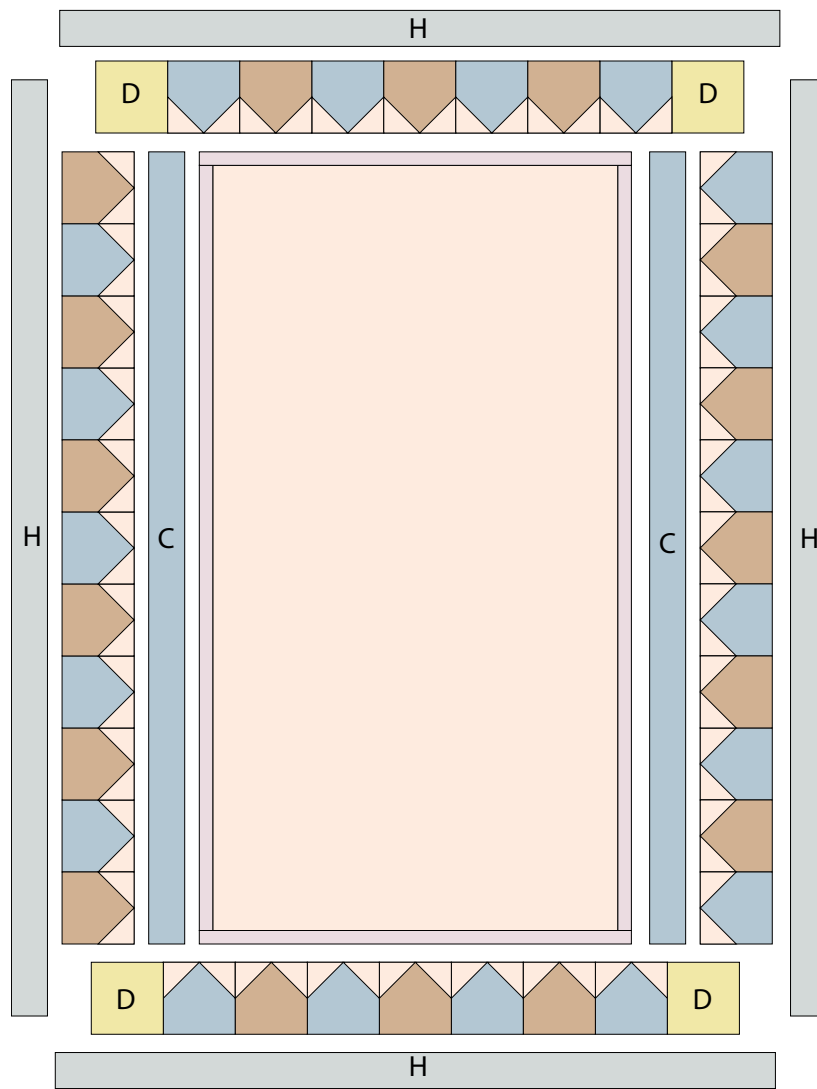
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

11. Press the quilt top and 48" x 64" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

12. Cut the ends of the (5) Fabric I binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

13. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
