## Cutting

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### **Fabric A (4130P-77 36" Panel - Navy):**

- Fussy cut (1) 35 ½" x 43 ½" panel.

#### **Fabric B (Flame-16 Peppered Cottons - Flame), cut:**

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 43 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 38 ½" WOF strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### **Fabric C (Ink-45 Peppered Cottons - Ink), cut:**

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 45 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 40 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 56 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 50 ½" strips.

#### **Fabric D (4135-1 School Buses All-Over - White), cut:**

- (6) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (22) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

#### **Fabric E (4138-77 Apples - Navy), cut:**

- (6) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 4 ½" squares.

#### **Fabric F (4136-1 Alphabet All-Over - White), cut:**

- (4) 6" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end matching the patterns and cut (2) 6" x 61 ½" strips.
- (3) 6" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end matching the patterns and cut (2) 6" x 58 ½" strips.

#### **Backing (4135-1 School Buses All-Over - White), cut:**

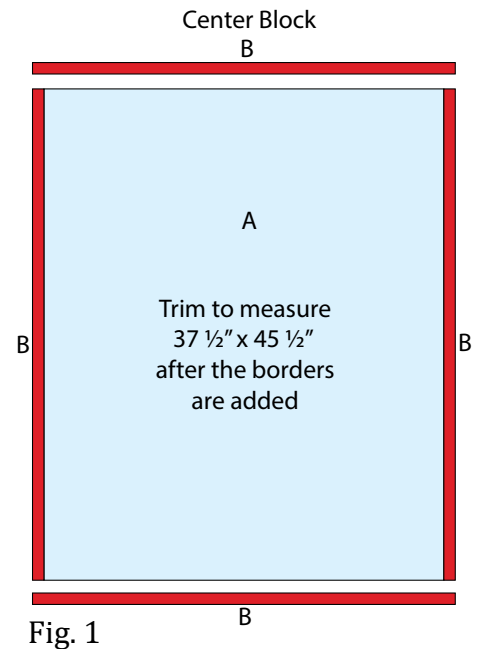
- (2) 69" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 69" x 77" to make the back.

## Sewing

Sew using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

### Block Assembly

1. Sew (1)  $2'' \times 43 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric B strip to each side of the  $35 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 43 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric A panel. Sew (1)  $2'' \times 38 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure  $37 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 45 \frac{1}{2}''$  to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).



2. Place (1)  $4 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric E square on the left side of (1)  $4 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 8 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 3). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.

3. Place another  $4 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric E square on the right side of the  $4 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 8 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 5).

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (22) Unit 1 strips.

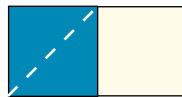

### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

5. Sew (1)  $2'' \times 45 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1)  $2'' \times 40 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

6. Sew (6) Unit 1 strips together end to end. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each side of the Center Block. Pay attention to the orientation of the strips.

7. Sew (5) Unit 1 strips together end to end. Sew (1)  $4 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric E square to each end of the strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block. Pay attention to the orientation of the strips.

8. Sew (1)  $1 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 56 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1)  $1 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 50 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

9. Sew (1)  $6'' \times 58 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1)  $6'' \times 61 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.



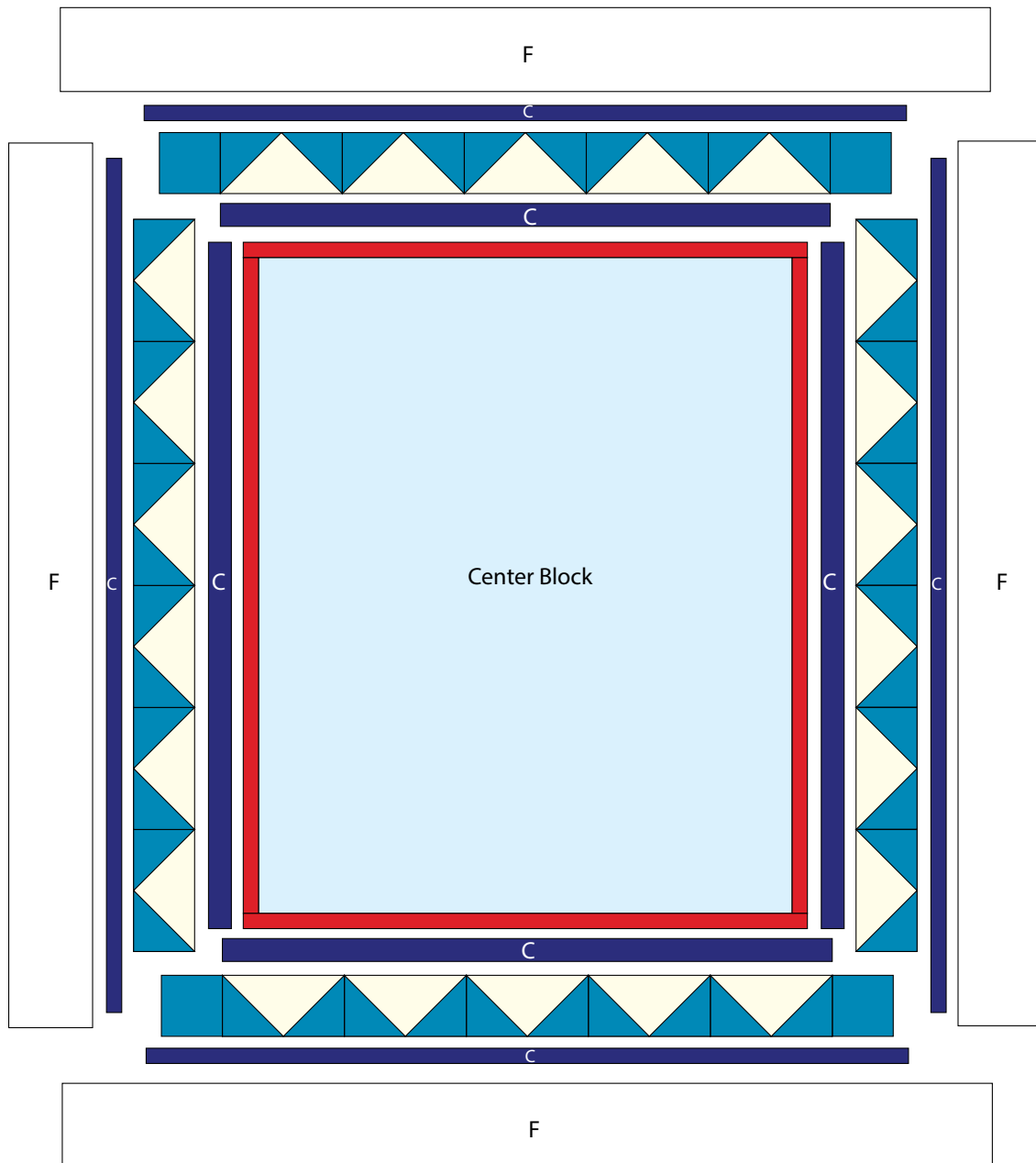
## Layering, Quilting and Finishing

10. Press the quilt top and 69" x 77" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

## Binding

11. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

12. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
