- (A) 3747P-70 1 panel
- (B) 16-Flame** 1 1/3 yards*
- (C) 3745-77 1/4 yard
- (D) 3741-40 1/2 yard
- (E) 36-True Cheddar** 1/8 yard
- (F) 78-Lagoon** 1/8 yard
- (G) 60-Aluminum** .. 1/2 yard

- (H) 3742-44 1/2 yard
- (I) 3743-16 1/4 yard
- (J) 3746-77 1 1/4 yards
- Backing
3742-11 5 yards

* Includes Binding

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (3747P-70 24" Space Adventure Panel – Navy/Multi), fussy cut:

- (1) 23" x 43" panel.

Fabric B (16-Flame Peppered Cottons – Flame), cut:

- (2) 2" x 43" WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 3 ½" x 26" WOF strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal strips and cut (2) 2" x 64 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 43 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric C (3745-77 Moons and Stars – Navy), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 6 ½" squares.

Fabric D (3741-40 Mini Stripe – Cream/Multi), cut:

- (8) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (44) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

Fabric E (36-True Cheddar Peppered Cottons – True Cheddar), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (44) 1 ½" squares.

Fabric F (78-Lagoon Peppered Cottons – Lagoon), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (44) 1 ½" squares.

Fabric G (60-Aluminum Peppered Cottons – Aluminum), cut:

- (8) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (44) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

Fabric H (3742-44 Space Shuttles – Cream), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (11) 6 ½" squares.

Fabric I (3743-16 Planets – Light Teal), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (5) 6 ½" squares.

Fabric J (3746-77 Mini Astronauts – Navy), cut:

- (4) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 67 ½" strips.
- (3) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 53 ½" strips.

Backing (3742-11 Space Shuttles – Light Blue), cut:

- (2) 85" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 61" x 85" for the back.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) 2" x 43" Fabric B strip to each side of the 23" x 43" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 26" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ " to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).

2. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to each end of (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric C square to make (1) Block One (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (6) Block Ones total.

3. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to each side of (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square to each end of (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric H square to make (1) Block Two (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (11) Block Twos total.

4. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to each end of (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric I square to make (1) Block Three (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (5) Block Threes total.

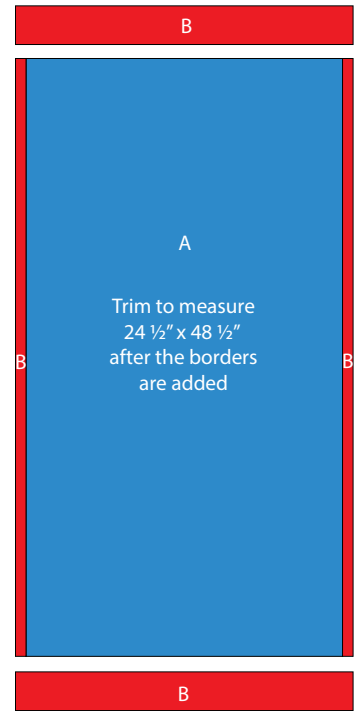

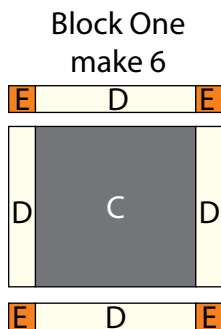

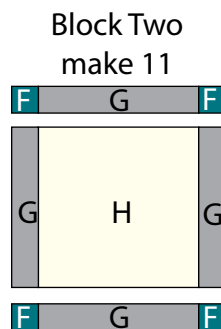

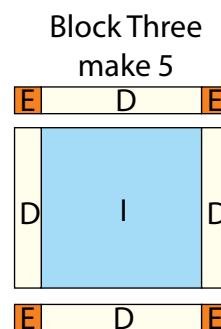

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

- Sew (6) assorted blocks together. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each side of the Center Block.
- Sew (5) assorted blocks together. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- Sew (1) 2" x 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 43 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- Sew (1) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 67 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 53 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

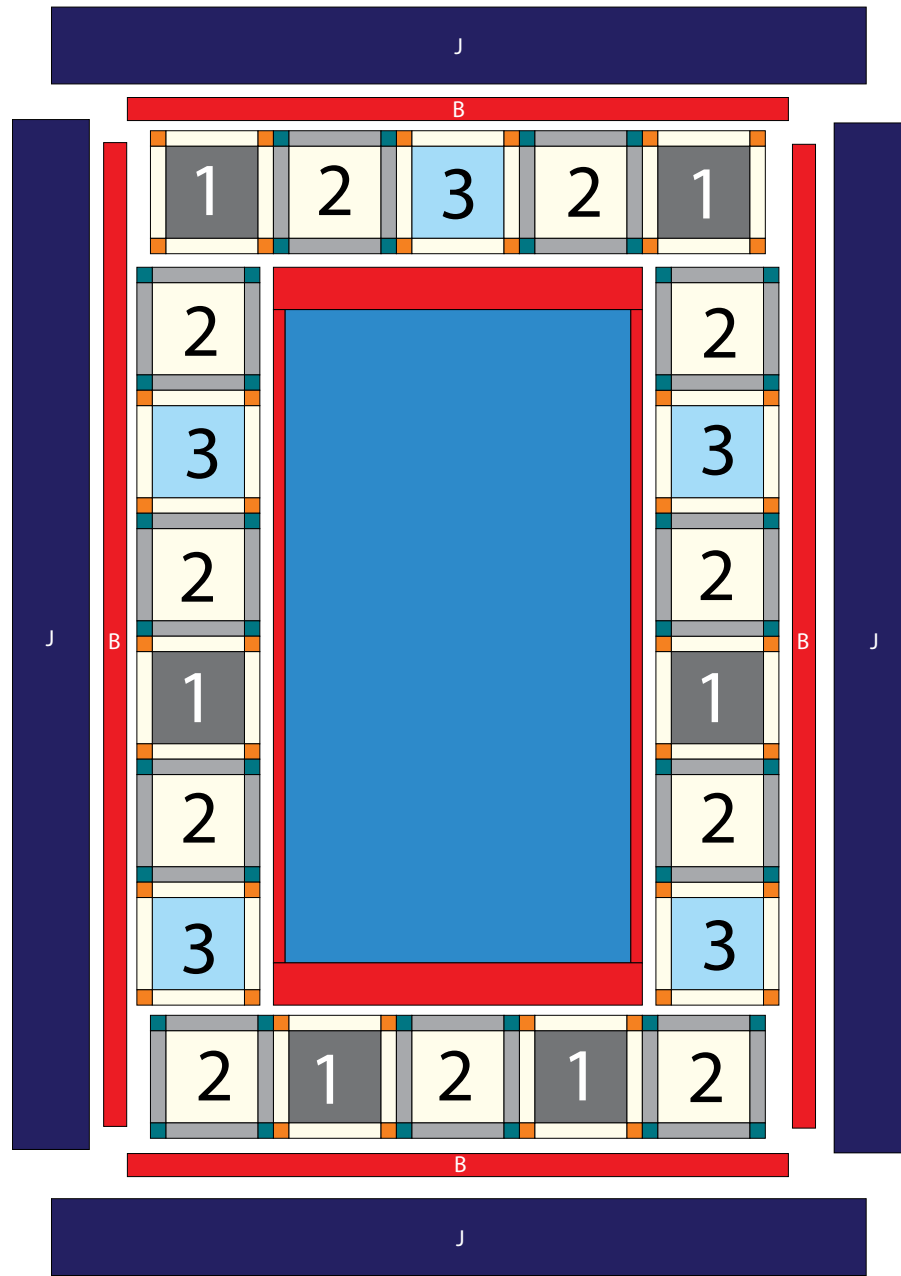
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

9. Press the quilt top and 61" x 85" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

10. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

11. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
